The Alamo Hires Program Manager and Construction Manager for Phase One of the Alamo Plan

SAN ANTONIO – The Alamo is proud to announce the selection of both a Program Manager and a Construction Manager for the Alamo Plan. Broaddus & Associates will serve as the Program Manager for the duration of the Alamo Plan, while Clark/Guido will be the Construction Manager for Phase One.

Broaddus & Associates will manage the planning and execution of the Alamo Museum project. They will work in conjunction with the existing design team for the planning and design of the Alamo Plan. Broaddus & Associates was ranked as one of the top 100 program management firms in the U.S. by McGraw Hill's *Engineering News-Record* magazine. Their previous projects include the McAllen Convention Center, the Galveston National Laboratory, and the expansion of Texas State University-San Marcos's Bobcat Stadium.

Clark/Guido is a joint venture between Clark Construction and Guido Construction. Clark recently completed the construction of the new Frost Tower in downtown San Antonio's Central Business District. Guido Construction, founded in 1927 and based in San Antonio, built the original base of the Cenotaph when it was first erected in 1939.

"The management and implementation of the Alamo Plan is in good hands with Broaddus, Clark, and Guido," Alamo CEO Douglass McDonald said. "We are particularly thrilled to have the same firm that built the Cenotaph's base in the 1930s in charge of reassembling it."
