



Battle of the Alamo Commemoration - February 22 - March 7



Starting Saturday, February 22 through Saturday, March 7, the Alamo will commemorate the anniversary of the 1836 battle with 15-days of special programs, tours, and events. There will be special living history demonstrations daily, and reverent ceremonies with organizations like the Daughters of the Republic of Texas, Sons of the Republic of Texas, the Grand Lodge of Texas, the San Antonio Living History Association, and more. Most of all, visitors will learn about the Texas Revolution and *why* we remember the Alamo 184 years later.

The public is encouraged to visit the Alamo during Commemoration, and the media is invited to the events below. Never Surrender or Retreat | Free


This living history demonstration will include a live reading and reenactment of the writing of the Travis Letter.
