SAN ANTONIO, TX. Feb. 1, 2021 – Polish your boots for a special day of cowboy-themed programming with "Round Up" at the Alamo on Saturday, Feb. 6. Just in time for the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo, this virtual and in-person event will show audiences of all ages what life was like for cowboys in the 1800s.

In-person living history programming will take place throughout the day, with demonstrations on 1800s games, cooking, branding, and more.
