Central to the new museum will be the priceless Alamo Collection, featuring artifacts like the Phil Collins Texana Collection, which includes irreplaceable treasures connected to the Texas Revolution.

This multi-year project, slated for completion in 2027, will not only protect the Alamo's physical structures but also expand its narrative to encompass its full 300-year history—from its founding as a Spanish mission in 1718, to its enduring role as a symbol of freedom, and beyond. The Alamo Plan reflects our dedication to education and preserving the legacy of the Alamo for generations to come.
