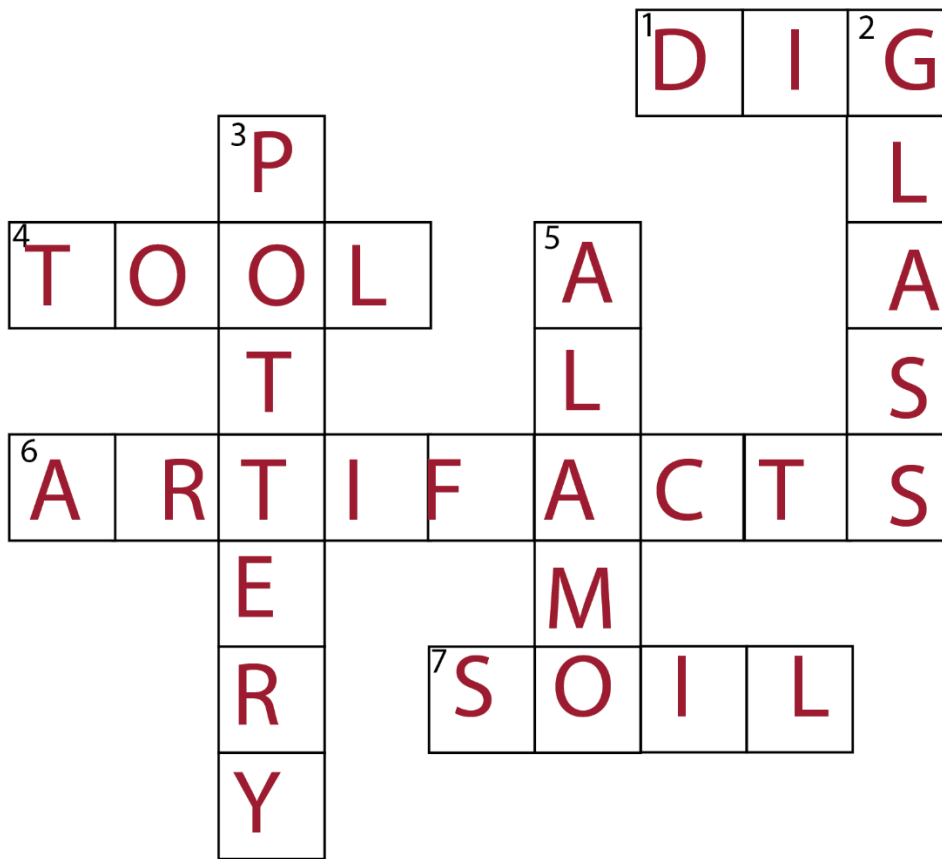
Down:

- The order and position of different geological layers that archaeologists use to understand time scale
- A piece of stone that comes off during flintknapping. Often looks triangular
- Material used to build the Alamo Church
- Irrigation ditches dug by the Spanish and found throughout San Antonio
- The original name of the Alamo site
- Immovable evidence of the human past, such as a hearth or wall foundation
- Fortification trench located at the south wall of Alamo compound
- Material used to make pottery

Across

- The 1836 Battle of the Alamo played an important role during this time
- Glossy, sometimes colorful, coating on ceramics
- The study of the past using material culture
- Permanent storage and care of artifacts at a museum
- Measuring tool to show dimensions
- Relationship of artifacts and their surroundings
- Archaeology is a part of this process of learning about the natural world
